

Student Program Compliance Guidelines				
Non-compliance Stages	<u>Grades</u>	<u>Behavior</u>	<u>Attendance</u>	<u>Mentor Meetings</u>
Stage 1 - Quarter Warning	Any student that receives 1 or more D's or F's in a quarter .	Any students that receives an ISS during a quarter.	Students that have more than 3 unexcused absences in a quarter.	Any student missing 2 or more mentor meetings in a quarter without notifying the mentor coordinator
Stage 2 - Semester Warning (grades only)	Semester Warning - 1 D or F for a semester grade with a GPA of 3.0 or higher			
Stage 3 - Probation (2 semesters)*	Any student that receives more than one D or F for final semester grades. If GPA is below 3.0, 1 low grade will place student on probation.	Any student that receives 3 or more incidents of ISS in a semester OR any student that receives a 1 to 2 day of OSS.	Any student who has 7 or more unexcused absences in a semester. Or for skipping class	Any student missing 4 or more mentor meetings in a semester without notifying the mentor coordinator
Stage 4 - Suspension with Appeal Option	Any student that is on probation and receives final semester grades of D or F. AP/IB/AICE and college classes will be taken into consideration	Any student that is already on probation and continues to receive ISS or OSS or any student that receives OSS of 3 days or more.	Any student that is already on probation and has 7 or more unexcused absences in a semester.	Any student already on probation that misses 2 or more mentor meetings in a semester without notifying the mentor coordinator
Stage 5 - Extended Probation or Withdrawal**	After the TSIC committee reviews the student's appeal the student will go on extended probation or be withdrawn	After the TSIC committee reviews the student's appeal the student will go on extended probation or be withdrawn	After the TSIC committee reviews the student's appeal the student will go on extended probation or be withdrawn	After the TSIC committee reviews the students appeal the student will go on extended probation or be withdrawn
Other non-compliant or auto-withdrawal criteria		Drugs or a crime will lead to an automatic withdrawal	Not participating in TSIC events is considered non-compliance	Refusal to participate in mentoring can result in removal from the program

*A student can come off of probation if they are compliant with all standards for 2 consecutive semesters.

**A student on extended probation will be withdrawn for any future non-compliance.
